GENERAL

In the UNITED STATES AND CANADA, Kiwanis International has a program of Comprehensive General Liability Insurance for Kiwanis. The policy is intended to provide legal liability insurance for sums which insureds may become legally obligated to pay as damages to third parties for bodily injury or property damage arising out of a Kiwanis-sponsored function or activity.

All insureds are automatically covered, and no action on your part is required.

The purpose of this brochure is to describe the plan in a manner which will enable Kiwanians to understand its application to their activities. The provisions of the policy apply to most normal liability exposures of Kiwanis clubs. This is a standard Comprehensive General Liability Policy and contains the standard exclusions used in such insurance.

Nothing in this brochure can be construed to extend, alter, vary or waive any of the provisions of the policy. If unusual situations arise which require further explanation, inquiry should be directed to:

\$2 million combined single limit per occurrence of bodily injury and property damage regardless of the number of insureds under the policy. In addition, there is a supplemental umbrella liability policy.

These coverages are excess over any other insurance in force covering your specific club activities.

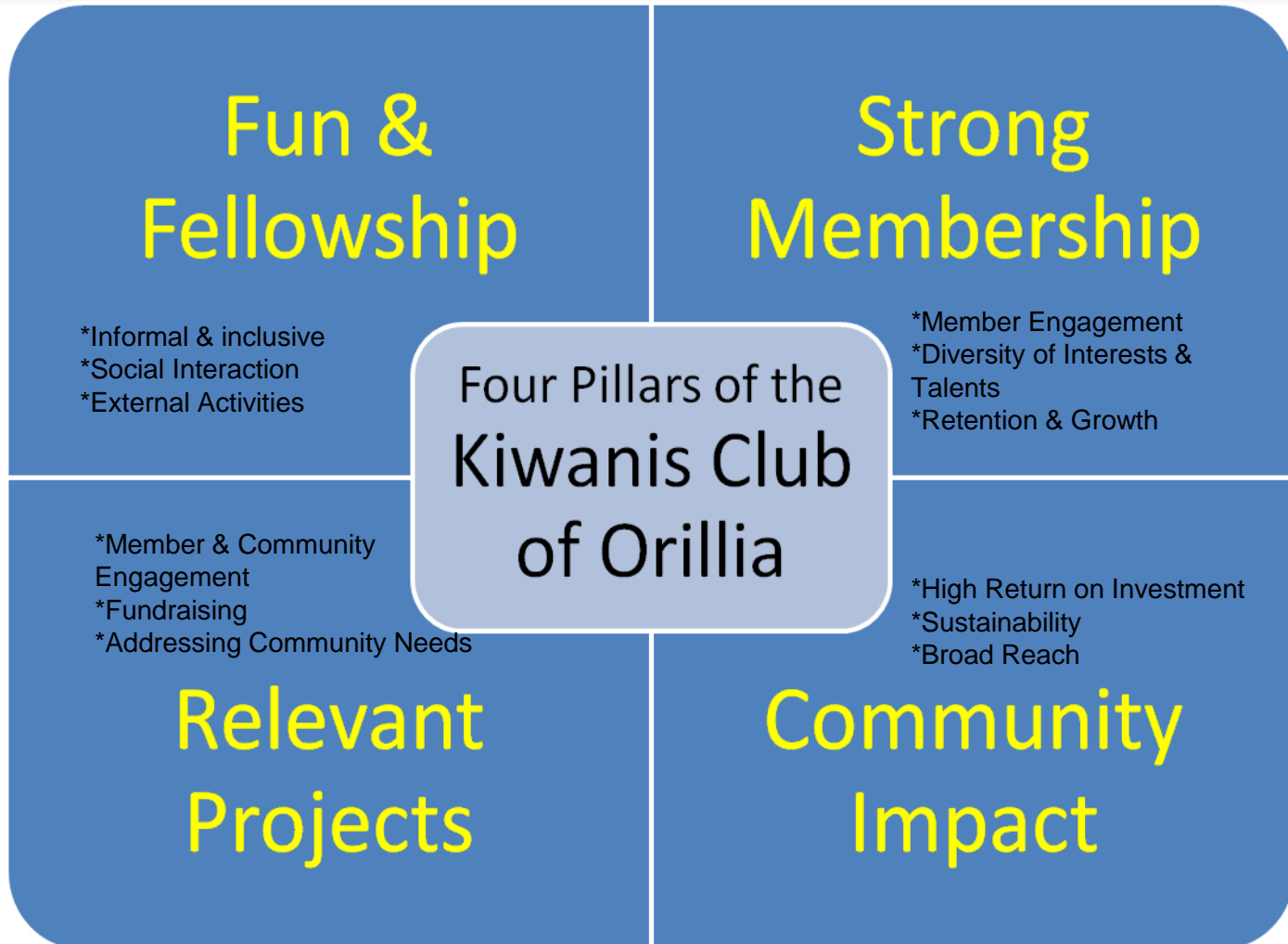

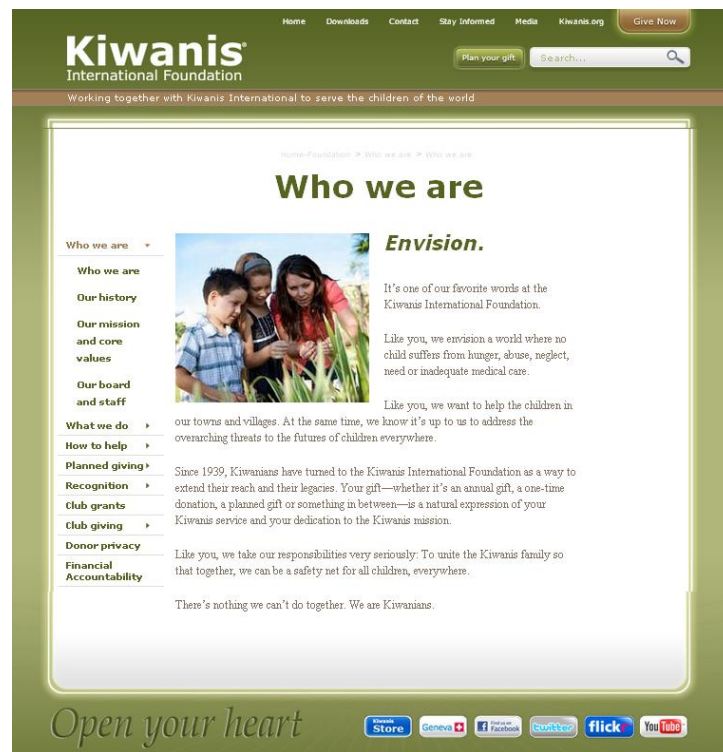

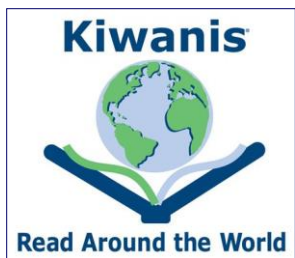
